

Dr. Ligia Noronha, Director, Resources and Global security Division, TERI

Dr. Ligia Noronha is a Senior Fellow in TERI and Director of the Resources and Global Security Division. She has an M.A. in Economics from the University of Bombay, and an M. Sc in Sea Use Law, Economics, and Policy, and a PhD on offshore oil policy from the London School of Economics. Her work at TERI includes research into resources policy, energy security, minerals development, sustainable tourism, coastal zone management, and issues relating to climate change. She has co-ordinated and worked on a number of research projects, supported by, amongst others, the Ford Foundation, IDRC, EU, ADB, Macarthur Foundation and the UK DFID. From April 2004 to April 2005, she worked at the International Development Research Centre, Canada, as the Team Leader of the Ecosystem Approaches to Human Health Program Initiative. Globally, she is associated with the Mining and Energy Research Network, UK, and was on the Global Assurance Group of the Mining, Minerals and Sustainable Development (MMSD) project of the IIED. She was involved with the Population Consumption and Environment Network, on the Program Advisory Committee of the International Forum on Ecosystem Approaches to Human Health, Montreal, May 18-23, 2003, and on the International steering Committee for the IHDP Open science Meeting, Montreal in October 2003. She is on the international Editorial Boards of Ecohealth and Experimental Agriculture.
